



Awards for Golf Tournaments

Golf tournaments are fun, competitive events with awards given to the tournament winners. Usually the first, second and third place finishers receive awards. These can be large or small, depending on your needs and budget. The most important thing is to recognize a well-played round in a meaningful way.

What Kinds of Awards are Appropriate for Golf?

Golf trophies, resin trophies, acrylic awards, and crystal awards are all examples of appropriate meaningful recognition for winners. These awards come in all price ranges, so you can consider your budget when choosing your tournament awards.

Tips for Your Golf Awards Ceremony

The awards presentation usually occurs shortly after the tournament ends. Most tournaments host a meal or social gathering, which is the perfect opportunity to have participants' attention. The awards presentation should occur as soon as possible after the totals have been tallied and most people have eaten. This is important because people will leave if they have other commitments or are not eligible for an award.

Pass out the awards in order. Start with the third place winner (Net Score first, followed by Gross Score), and proceed to the second place winners (Net Score first, followed by Gross Score). Next recognize the 'Closest to the Pin' and the 'Longest Drive' winners. Add fun and laughter by awarding the worst place team with a joke trophy. The suspense of who won should be high at this point! Finally, award the tournament winners (Net Champion, followed by Gross Champion).

Stagger raffle or door prizes throughout the awards presentation. Give a few larger prizes after the winners have been announced; participants often view the last raffle prize as their cue to leave.
